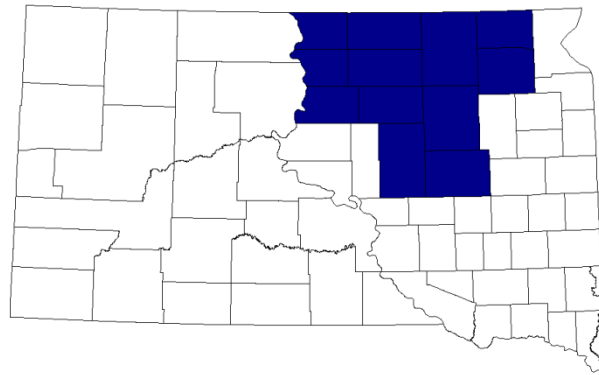

## Introduction

## Background

NECOG is a voluntary association of county and municipal governments that was established in 1973. The 12-county region is a U.S. Economic Development Administration designated “Economic Development District”. NECOG is considered to be a “quasi-governmental” organization

## Funding

NECOG is financed through membership dues, administrative charges, state and federal agency service contracts, special purpose grants, and technical assistance fees. The 2016 expense budget was \$534,996. Approximately 26% of NECOG funding comes from local government dues.

## Twelve Month Highlights

The following programs, services, and assistance activities were provided throughout the region.

- A total of 66 applications were prepared.
- Successful proposals resulted in \$35,530,979 of outside funding.
- 9 businesses received NECOG-DC loans totaling \$677,500.
- NECOG-DC assistance leveraged \$562,036 in private investment. There were 23.5 jobs created or retained.
- NECOG is assisting in coordinating and collecting information to be used for the County Site Analysis program through the SD Department of Agriculture. Seven NECOG counties have been completed and four more are in the initial stages of having the analysis completed. NECOG is continuing to work with completed plans and follow up work activities continue.
- NECOG has entered into an agreement with the SD Department of Agriculture to assist counties with follow up activities to be completed locally with the completion of the County Site Analysis plans.
- NECOG continues to be a board member of the Regional Aging Council and provides ongoing support to the Council, with a focus on elderly transportation.
- NECOG serves on the executive committee of the Area Health Education Center (AHEC) and provides ongoing regional support.
- District staff attended nearly 250 separate, meetings throughout the region.
- NECOG continued to assist the South Dakota Department of Transportation with a road inventory project.
- Three Pre-Disaster Mitigation Plans were completed, initial work has begun on securing funding on additional plans with work anticipated to begin in the fall of 2017.
- 11 cities and counties were assisted with land use planning or municipal ordinances creation or revisions.
- Numerous local governments were assisted with register/update of the System for Award Management. SAM requires active status to be eligible for federal program application and award.
- Provided census information throughout the region utilizing data results of the 2010 Census and subsequent American Community Survey releases.
- Provided ongoing information on numerous grant and loan programs available to Cities and Counties in the region.
- Participated in County association meetings and Municipal League district meetings in the region.

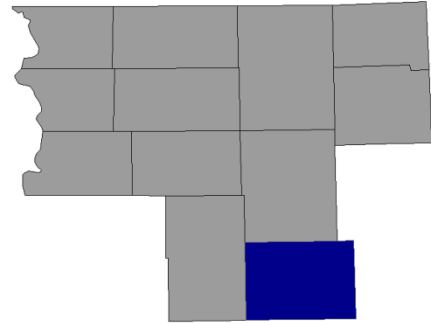
## Overall Funding Total

Since 1997, NECOG has assisted its membership in obtaining \$346,880,623 in outside funding assistance. This figure represents \$3,759, for every person in the region (based on 2010 Census). NECOG has also directly received \$5,869,242 in grants and contracts from State, Federal and Local Foundations. This money has been used to provide direct services back to the region.
