COMMUNITY ACCESS/INDUSTRIAL PARK/AGRI-BUSINESS GRANT PROGRAM

This program has announced new changes this year for grant percentage and grant amount.

Community Access Grants are State funds for all Counties and Towns with less than 5,000 in population and are for the construction or reconstruction of major streets in town such as Main Street and roads that lead to elevators, schools, hospitals, and farm-to-market roads. This program provides for 80% of the construction costs of the project, not including engineering or utility work. Grant size is limited to \$600,000 and applications are due July 16.

The Industrial Park and Agri-Business Grant Programs provide funds to assist communities and counties who have a new industry or agribusiness and need new or expanded access to the facilities. The Industrial Park grant has a \$500,000 grant limit.

Only applications for new projects will be considered. These two programs accept applications 3 times each year (April, July and October 15). COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG)

South Dakota receives more than \$5 million in grant funds every year from the Department of Housing and Urban Development for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program. Eligible applicants are counties and incorporated municipalities. Counties and municipalities can sponsor an application for an entity such as a fire district or non-profit that may have an eligible project.

The CDBG program has been an important funding source for many projects in our region. During the past few years the most common type of projects have been: community centers, fire halls, water and waste water systems, libraries, and removing unoccupied and dilapidated housing.

A registered professional engineer or architect must provide cost estimates and designs (map, floor plan, site identification). Engineers or architects are required on all CDBG projects. A local match of 50% will be required, with a maximum grant amount of \$750,000.

Not all counties and municipalities automatically qualify, for those that don't an income survey can be completed within the service area to determine eligibility. Applications are received twice a year on April 1 and October 1. Contact the staff at NECOG at 626-2595 for more information or if you have a possible project you would like to discuss.

NECOG DC BUSINESS LOANS

The NECOG Development Corporation is a non-profit organization that operates a Revolving Loan Fund (RLF) program which assists small businesses and entrepreneurs to gain access to funding. NECOG-DC services a twelve county area which includes: Beadle, Brown, Campbell, Day, Edmunds, Faulk, Hand, McPherson, Marshall, Potter, Spink, and Walworth.

Don't think your project qualifies? Call and find out. Funds can be used for both the purchase of an existing business or the startup of a new business. NECOG-DC can also fund projects that include: acquisitions, renovations, inventory, equipment, and on a limited basis working capital.

Applications are considered on a case-by-case basis and all loan decisions are made by the NECOG-DC Board of Directors.
