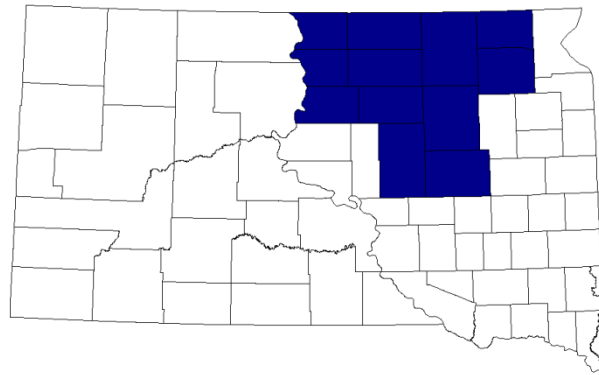

Introduction

NECOG is a voluntary association of county and municipal governments that was established in 1973. The 12-county region is a U.S. Economic Development Administration designated “Economic Development District”. NECOG is considered to be a “quasi-governmental” organization

Funding

NECOG is financed through membership dues, administrative charges, state and federal agency service contracts, special purpose grants, and technical assistance fees. The 2019 expense budget was \$577,494. Approximately 26% of NECOG funding comes from local government dues.

Twelve Month Highlights

The following programs, services, and assistance activities were provided throughout the region.

- A total of 73 applications were prepared.
- Successful proposals resulted in \$22,455,633 of outside funding.
- 10 businesses received NECOG-DC loans totaling \$934,328.
- NECOG-DC assistance leveraged \$1,860,654 in private investment. There were 28 jobs created or retained.
- NECOG in conjunction with the other planning districts completed an update to a statewide County Wage Survey that was distributed to each County in the state.
- NECOG continues to be a board member of the Regional Aging Council and provides ongoing support to the Council, with a focus on elderly transportation.
- District staff attended over 200 separate, meetings throughout the region.
- NECOG continued to assist the South Dakota Department of Transportation with a road inventory project.
- 1 Pre-Disaster Mitigation Plans received funding, 3 plans are awaiting funding and work has been completed or continued on 9 plans.
- 1 County Hazardous Material Plan was adopted and 2 additional County plans are seeking funding.
- 17 cities and counties were assisted with land use planning or municipal ordinances assistance, creation, or revisions.
- Numerous local governments and private businesses were assisted with register/update of the System for Award Management. SAM requires active status to be eligible for federal program application and award.
- Provided census information throughout the region utilizing data results of the 2010 Census and subsequent American Community Survey releases.
- Provided ongoing information on numerous grant and loan programs available to Cities and Counties in the region.
- Participated in County association meetings and Municipal League district meetings in the region.

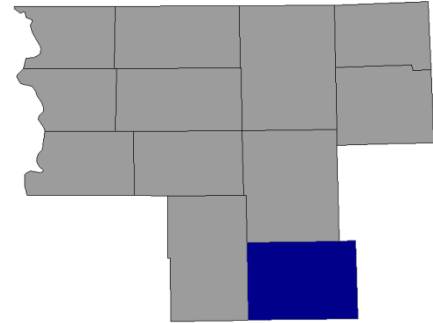
Overall Funding Total

Since 1997, NECOG has assisted its membership in obtaining \$463,766,490 in outside funding assistance. This figure represents \$5,026, for every person in the region (based on 2010 Census). NECOG has also directly received \$6,297,985 in grants and contracts from State, Federal and Local Foundations. This money has been used to provide direct services back to the region.
