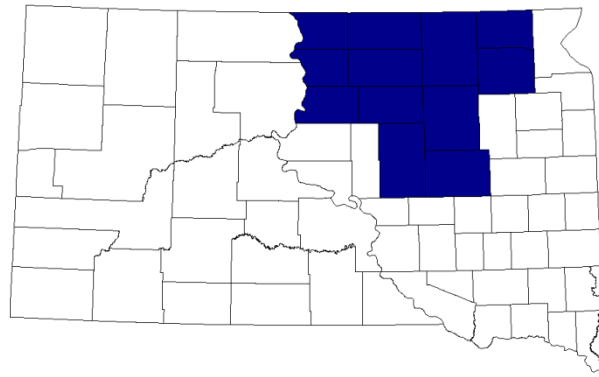

## Introduction

## Background

NECOG is a voluntary association of county and municipal governments that was established in 1973. The 12-county region is a U.S. Economic Development Administration designated “Economic Development District”. NECOG is considered to be a “quasi-governmental” organization

## Funding

NECOG is financed through membership dues, administrative charges, state and federal agency service contracts, special purpose grants, and technical assistance fees. The 2020 expense budget was \$652,833. Approximately 23% of NECOG funding comes from local government dues.

## Twelve Month Highlights

The following programs, services, and assistance activities were provided throughout the region.

- A total of 99 applications were prepared.
- Successful proposals resulted in \$39,108,866 of outside funding.
- NECOG and NECOG DC received an additional \$2,848,241 in direct funding.
- 10 businesses received NECOG-DC loans totaling \$1,576,000.
- NECOG-DC assistance leveraged \$4,758,279 in private investment. There were 55.5 jobs created or retained.
- NECOG under a contract from the SD Bureau of Finance and Management assisted our 12 Counties and 75 Cities in accessing an initial allocated amount of \$21,313,365 from the CARES Act. This activity required providing direct guidance to meet the program rules and communicating ongoing updates throughout the process.
- District staff attended far fewer meetings this year due to the pandemic. Telephone calls and Zoom meetings took their place. Specific numbers were not tracked, but this method of communicating with members played a significant role in meeting the work activity this year.
- NECOG continued to assist the South Dakota Department of Transportation with a road inventory project for all township, city and county roads in the region.
- 3 County Pre-Disaster Mitigation Plans received funding and work has been completed or continued on 5 additional plans.
- 2 County Hazardous Material Plans were completed and adopted.
- 12 cities and counties were assisted with land use planning or municipal ordinances assistance, creation, or revisions.
- Numerous local governments and private businesses were assisted with registering/updating of the System for Award Management. SAM requires active status to be eligible for federal program application and award.
- Provided census information throughout the region utilizing data results of the 2010 Census and subsequent American Community Survey releases.
- Provided ongoing information on numerous grant and loan programs available to Cities and Counties in the region.
- Participated in County association meetings and Municipal League district meetings in the region.

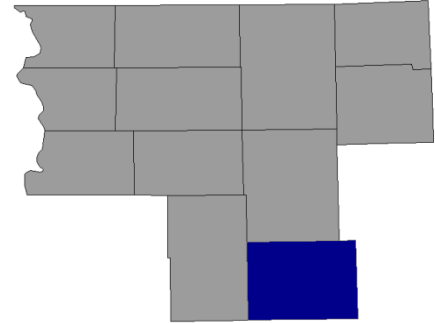
## Overall Funding Total

Since 1997, NECOG has assisted its membership in obtaining \$502,875,357 in outside funding assistance. This figure represents \$5,450, for every person in the region (based on 2010 Census). NECOG has also directly received \$9,389,493 in grants and contracts from State, Federal and Local Foundations. This money has been used to provide direct services back to the region.
